In such cases, candidates from other grades may be considered if they demonstrate strong motivation, readiness to embark on an international experience, and receive full approval from their parents or guardians as well as their instructors. When can I enroll in a pre-college program?

Candidates can apply to Unicollege's pre-college programs at any time throughout the year, as enrollments are open year-round.

However, the program primarily operates with two major intakes: the Fall session typically begins in September or October, and the Spring session starts in February or March. For those who require a quicker start, Unicollege offers the flexibility to request an accelerated enrollment within 45 to 60 days.
